Shea is being raised by a fellow clubwoman - Kathleen, with the hope that he goes on to become an assistance dog for a child, veteran or adult with a disability. \$50,000 - that's what it takes to raise, train and place a Canine Companions for Independence® assistance dog along with the lifetime of care and support provided to the graduate team.
