

1. **“It’s a Dog’s Life”** – Our club is very dedicated to Canine Companions for Independence (CCI) and we never want to miss an opportunity to help this amazing program! This year we were very active with CCI. Four members traveled to Ocoee to serve lunch to students, families and staff (27 people) at the Canine Companions for Independence Team Training. Cost of items for lunch was \$68.18. Club members donated brownies and deviled eggs. All four members toured the facility. Three members and one guest attended the CCI Sea World Graduation. We love to have “our” puppies visit our meetings! “Sottil” visited our February General Meeting for picture taking and to say “goodbye” as she prepared to start advance training. A \$55 donation for CCI was raised. “Cadet” visited the members before the November meeting started. Pictures were taken of Cadet with various Club members. The pictures were received by email a week later. Our club voted at the December 2010 board meeting to sponsor another CCI puppy at the cost of \$500. This will be our 5th puppy and we are excited to see it grow and learn. Our Home Life Chairman submitted a GFWC Florida Department Grant Application in February seeking a \$100 grant for redecorating a second Canine Companions for Independence dorm room. Home Life Department received the \$100 grant at the GFWC Convention, then presented to the membership by the Club’s President at the May general meeting. A “Beach Party Bunco” fundraiser was held in August to benefit our club’s CCI ventures. Attendees enjoyed an evening of fun and games at a local golf course. Finally, \$10 was donated to Canine Companions for Independence on the GFWC Florida Remittance Form.
2. **“Healthy Members”** – We know that a healthy club member is a productive club member so our club shares health related information with our members on a regular basis through newsletter articles and activities at our club meetings. Six Club members completed Heart Pillows for heart patients at a sewing meeting. A total of sixty pillows were then delivered to the Wuesthoff Hospital Rockledge Public Relations Office. February was Heart Month and Club members were encouraged to “Wear Red for Women” at the General Membership Meeting. A speaker gave a presentation on “Women’s Heart Health” and provided handouts to the members. A \$45 donation was raised for the American Heart Association through a contest to see how many heart-shaped candies were in a jar. Members could pay \$1.00 to guess the correct number and the winner received the jar of candy.
3. **“Show Me the Money”** - Planning for Your Financial Future Speaker: Public Relations Chairman, Sarah Korab, and her husband (owners of a nationwide financial and insurance company) educated club members on financial protection, “SAFE” investment strategy for the middle age and elderly, and planning for grandchildren’s college education at the March membership meeting.

4. **“Cancer Awareness”** - Statistics show that everyone will be affected by cancer at some point in their life, either through their own diagnosis or that of a loved one. Our club supports many cancer related programs in our community. A donation of \$50 was made to the Ovarian Cancer Coalition on behalf of a member who died of cancer during the year. Approximately eight members attended the Brevard County Making Strides Against Breast Cancer 5K Walk, many in honor of our own member, who lost her battle with cancer. Eight members participated in Viera Relay for Life in April. One also served on the “Survivor Dinner” committee. Members were made aware of the breast cancer awareness “Artful Bra Project” for participation at the 2010 Convention and \$10 was donated to Rock Camp and Boggy Creek (Cancer camps) on the GFWC Florida Remittance Form.
5. **“Holiday Gift Wrapping Fundraiser”** - The Belk Holiday Gift Wrap Fund Raiser was held every Friday and Saturday during November and December with four, three hour shifts each day. Twenty four club members volunteered, many volunteered more than once, and nine Junioresettes. A total of \$806.82 for the Woman's Club Home Life CSP and \$92 for the Junioresettes were collected in donations.
6. **“Alzheimer's Awareness”** – Each month a group of seven to ten club members play bingo and visit with residents at “Autumn House”, a local Alzheimer's Resident Care Center. Our club donated \$50 to “Joe's Club”, an Alzheimer's Day Care facility. We also informed club members about Alzheimer's in a newsletter article.
7. **“Habitat for Humanity”** - A representative from the local Habitat for Humanity spoke at the March general membership meeting. He informed the membership on the organization's purpose and the local all-woman build project in progress. In November, club members helped Habitat for Humanity stuff and fold envelopes for their Christmas mailing. Five members were joined by one husband to complete the project
8. **“Share the Joy” Baby Shower** – Club members held a baby shower at the March membership meeting and donated baby food, clothing and miscellaneous baby items for the North Brevard Sharing Center.
9. **March of Dimes** – The Club donated \$50 to the March of Dimes.

10. **“One Can at a Time”** – The Club participated in the challenge made by the Coral Springs Woman's Club: “One Can at a Time.” At each of our monthly meetings, our members donated non-perishable foods that were taken to a local food bank.

11. **“Horse Therapy for Disabled”** – “Harmony Farms” is dedicated to improving the quality of life for disabled individuals through interaction with horses. We donated \$50 to assist their ongoing work.

12. **“Use of Accessible Facilities”** – The Club's general membership meetings and fundraisers are held in facilities that are accessible to women with disabilities.
